



Elliot Adler is a lawyer and scientist with expertise ranging from M&A to patents, and organic chemistry to molecular biology. He is proficient in spoken and written Chinese and lived and worked in Shanghai and Beijing from 2008 to 2018.

Previously, Elliot was General Counsel and Chief Compliance Officer at Hone Capital. Prior to that, he directed APAC legal affairs for established brand and immunology franchises at UCB and was a member of UCB China's Leadership Team. Prior to that, he was Head of International Legal Affairs at WuXi AppTec. Prior to that, he worked in M&A, PE and corporate finance as an associate at Skadden, Arps in New York and Debevoise & Plimpton in Shanghai, and was a patent agent at Frommer Lawrence & Haug in New York.

Before becoming a lawyer, Elliot was a scientist. He studied biochemistry as an undergraduate at Reed College and as a doctoral student with Jeremy Knowles at Harvard University. He was a postdoctoral in molecular biology and genetics at IBPC Paris and Tokyo University of Agriculture and Technology, and in molecular neuroscience on the team at UCSD and NIH that discovered the human receptors for bitter taste. Elliot then led the team at the start-up biotech Senomyx that discovered the human receptors for sweet and savory taste. Elliot holds a BA in chemistry at Reed College, a PhD in chemistry at Harvard University and a JD from Harvard Law School.
